

Incorporation. The club's Board of Directors has decided to incorporate the club. One of the primary reasons to do this is to provide legal protection to club's directors and officers. As an unincorporated association, club's Directors and Officers may be personally liable for any liability of the club. As a corporation, liability would be limited to the assets and insurance coverage of the club.

At the November club meeting, the membership approved expenses up to \$500 to cover the costs of incorporating the club. At the December meeting, we will be asking the club for formal approval to go ahead with incorporation of the club. This approval allows the Board to proceed to file the papers to create the corporation sometime in late January or early February.

Flea Market. As was announced at the November club meeting, the Perham Foundation is merging with the History Museum of San Jose. One consequence of this is that the Perham Foundation will no longer be sponsoring the Flea Markets at Foothill College. This leaves the eight organizations that participate in the Flea Markets with a problem.

To address this problem, a meeting was called on December 12th at 7:30pm held at the Perham Foundation offices to discuss what if anything should be done about this problem. All eight groups were represented at this meeting. The outcome of this meeting was a decision to create a new organization to run the flea markets. This new organization is to be incorporated and run by the member organizations (including FARS).

In order to cover the expenses of this new organization, each participating organization will be required to submit funds to this new group of \$750. This money is needed to complete incorporation and to pay Foothill College the up front fees for the use of their property for Flea Markets. We will be asking the club membership to approve the \$750 to be disbursed by the club to the new organization sometime in early February.

Banquet. Tom Schiller, N6BT of Force-12 fame will be the speaker for the FARS/PAARA banquet. Now is the time to sign up for the banquet and to renew your FARS membership. The banquet is always well received by the attendees so don't miss out. Thanks to Andreas, N6NU from PAARA for making arrangements for our banquet speaker. Speaker: Dave Platt, AE6EO

Subject: IEEE 802.11 Wireless Local Area Networks (WLAN)

Summary: Dave Platt, AE6EO, will talk about the popular 802.11 "wireless Ethernet" technology. Dave will describe the radio technology used in the physical layer (frequencies, modulations, and spectrum-spreading techniques) and higher layers focusing on implementation (the MAC) and security (WEP encryption, "wardriving", network breaking, and countermeasures). Dave will also describe the relationship between 802.11 and amateur operations in the 13 cm amateur band, and he'll show his nice collection of 802.11b antennas.

NTS via Packet

In connection with the fine National Traffic System (NTS) presentation at our October meeting by Pink, KG6ILA, it is worthwhile to point out that most amateur packet BBSs (Bulletin Board Systems) support NTS with special commands. To post an NTS radiogram use the ST (Send Traffic) command like this: ST zip@NTSxx where zip is the destination zip code and xx is the destination state postal code. The subject line should contain the code QTC followed by the destination city, area code, and telephone number prefix. The preamble (message no., HX code, priority, etc. as discussed by Pink) is put in the body of the message. The BBS will route the message to a (possibly) remote BBS based on the zip code.

To list a directory of NTS messages posted on your BBS, use the LT (List Traffic) command. To read an NTS message, use the usual R yyyy (Read message no. yyyy). If you choose to service a message, come back after servicing and kill the message using the KT (Kill Traffic) or K (Kill) command, to avoid duplicate servicing.

What is ARES?

Amateur Radio Emergency Services, or ARES, is the field arm of the Amateur Radio Relay League (ARRL). The League deals with all aspects of Amateur Radio, including legislation, licensing, and contests; the ARES branch specifically handles field communications, particularly during emergencies. When you hear in the news that Amateur Radio operators were part of a search and rescue operation, assisted in getting aid to a ship in trouble at sea, or provided communications for a Red Cross shelter, you're hearing about an ARES function.

ARES volunteers also offer a splendid community service by providing free administrative communications at planned events, such as air shows, parades, and bike rides. In addition to helping the community through such service, experienced and inexperienced operators alike can use such events to refresh and polish their emergency-response skills.

ARES operators provide their own insurance.

You become an ARES amateur radio operator by joining [ARRL](http://www.arrl.org), but a "Ham" does not need to be a member of ARRL to participate in ARES. If you become an Emergency Coordinator (EC), you do need to join ARRL.

What is RACES?

Radio Amateur Civil Emergency Services, or RACES, is the communications branch of the Federal Emergency Management System (FEMA). When a governmental entity (that is, a representative of the City, County, State, or Federal government) requests amateur radio assistance, the response is through RACES. This is because governmental activation alters several aspects of disaster-response funding, including insurance coverage. Governmental requests usually involve a disaster or other wide-reaching emergency. When you hear in the news that amateur radio operators are assisting officials within an officially declared disaster zone, such as in the aftermath of a hurricane, earthquake, flood, you're hearing about a RACES function. RACES operators are covered in California by Disaster Service Worker (DSW) insurance. This is a variety of Worker's Compensation.

You become a RACES amateur radio operator by *signing up for DSW* and registering with your local RACES organization--or, in Santa Clara County, your local ARES/RACES organization. (The procedure for signing up for DSW is part of the ARES/RACES Policies and Procedures Manual.

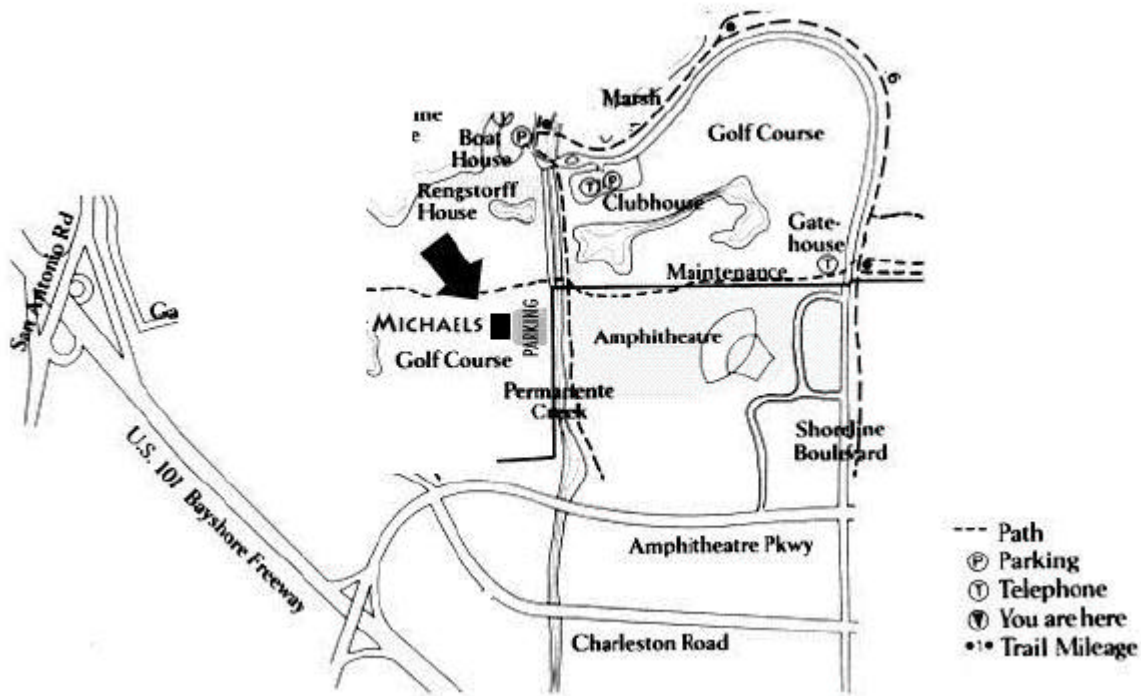

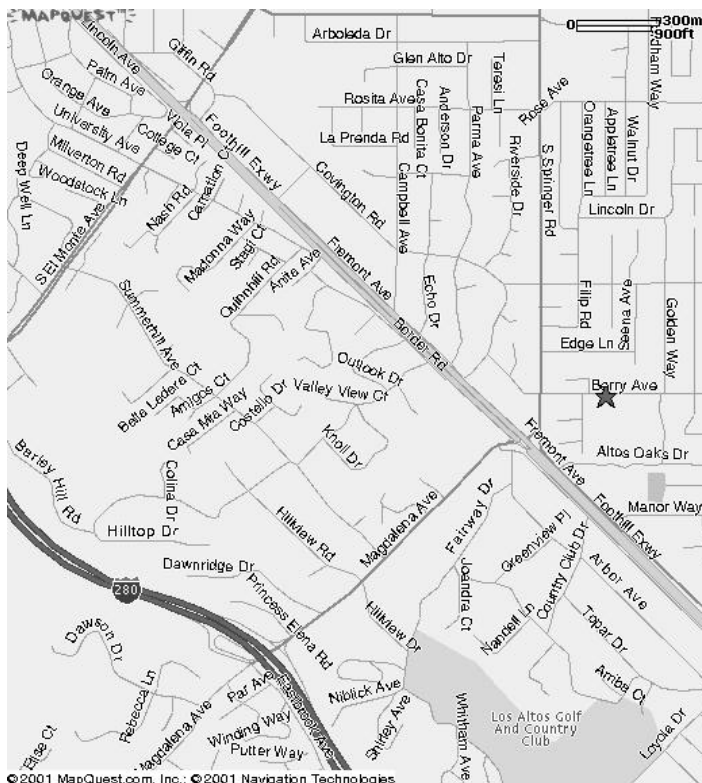

How to get to meetings:

(Visitors always welcome)

Our meetings usually will be held at the Loyola School gym room (directions below) on the fourth Friday at 7 PM for the code practice/socializing and 7:30 PM for the regular meeting. There may be changes in the meeting dates for January, June, November, and December.

DIRECTIONS:

Loyola School is at 770 Berry Avenue in Los Altos, between Springer Rd. and Miramonte Ave.

FROM FOOTHILL EXPWY take the Rancho shopping center exit and go east (toward El Camino Real) on Springer one short block; turn right onto Berry; watch for the school parking lot on your right. Walk past the office and turn right. The gym is the first building on your right.

FROM I-280 take the Magdalena Av. exit and go east (towards Foothill Expwy). Cross Foothill Expwy onto Springer; then follow directions as above.
