How to get call sign license plates for your car.

Amateur radio license plates are not the same as the "personalized" plates or "special-interest" plates. There is a different application process. Also there is only a one-time fee. The personalized and special-interest plates have an annual renewal fee.

Start here: http://www.dmv.ca.gov/pubs/plates/specialplates.htm

Even if you are not planning to get call plates, check out this page because one of the examples is for a long time FARS member!

There will be a link to a form which you should print and fill out. Next you will have to apply in person at a DMV office. The office in Mountain View was recently closed. For most club members, the most convenient office is near El Camino and Lawrence Expressway. Go to the DMV home page to get the days and hours. They are open some Saturdays and closed some Mondays. You now have two choices:

Make an appointment on-line. Expect that the earliest appointment will be 2 or 3 weeks.

Go early in the morning. If you get there by 8:30, with no appointment, the wait could be only a few minutes. If you arrive later, expect to wait an hour or more.

When you go, bring all of these:

The completed form.

Your original FCC license. The form says attach a copy, but the DMV wants to see the original.

Cash or check for the application fee, currently \$21.

Tools to remove the license plates. If you don't have an appointment, you might have time to go back outside to remove the plates while waiting for your turn.
