

FARS field day was my second time seeing "the experts" at work and, as a first anniversary ham, was I impressed. This year, I was at the CW station, watching with reverent awe as Walt (W6ASH) sent and received code at 35-40 wpm using an iambic keyer (I'm still struggling with 5 wpm). He just went at it searching the frequencies and making the contacts --which included Florida, Alaska, and the Virgin Islands. He said it was "fun" and looked forward to the annual field day. I was lucky enough to be one of his assistants with the chance to log the contacts using PSK31, something else new for me. I can hardly wait till next year.

Here are the highlights of the VHF/Sat field day operations

We made one satellite contact made via AO-07 to a Virginia Station, giving us the 100 bonus points. There were lots of QRM during the satellite contact due to a massive pileup, but a contact was made. Six meter contacts made things interesting this year due to sporadic E ionization. Due to this ionization, contacts were made to Eastern states and as far away as South Carolina, Mid west into Kansas with closer contacts into New Mexico and Colorado. All these contacts were done on the clubs 6 meter log periodic antenna up 20 feet fixed in a position aiming due East. These contacts were in brief windows of opportunity that appeared as unexpected strong sideband signals then just as fast faded quickly to silence in a wave like fashion, because of this phenomenon. No wonder six meters is called the "Magic Band.". Two meter contacts were made locally to the East Bay, Santa Clara Valley, San Joaquin Valley and San Francisco sections. Field day ended with Andy Korsak, KR6DD, attempting to get us bonus points for Natural power by using a hand crank, in desperation for the needed five contacts, Andy was yelling into the mic along with Peter Griffith, WA6VAQ, in pleas for contacts as people took turns cranking. Peter muttered into the mic something about needing contacts and eating baked beans (from breakfast) for energy. One well known (locally) 2 meter Field Day contester from the East Bay section, N6WG- November Six Wild Girl, stated on the air while hearing the commotion "Keep cranking and eat more beans you'll make those contacts.... three minutes left !!!" Though the natural power attempt was unsuccessful (Two out of a needed five contacts), it sure made for an amusing and memorable end to Field Day 2004.....Tnx Andy.
