FARS Field Day 2005

The Foothills Amateur Radio Society is participating in the American Radio Relay League (ARRL) 2005 Field Day event. Our operations will begin on Saturday June 25th at 11:00 AM and conclude on Sunday June 26th at 11:00 AM. We will set up our stations, antennas, and other gear on Friday, June 24th.

FARS will operate in the 2A category. We will operate two radio stations on emergency power at a temporary location. Paul Zander, AA6PZ, is the band captain for the Single Sideband (SSB) voice station. Mikel Lechner, KN6QI, is the band captain for the combination CW (Morse Code) and a PSK31/RTTY (keyboard) station. The Field Day rules permit us to operate a VHF station (not counted in category number). Our VHF station captain, Phil Hawkins/KA6MZE, will make some contacts via satellite for extra points in the scoring. FARS will be using the club callsign, K6YA.

We plan to demonstrate other amateur radio communication modes including SSTV (Slow Scan TeleVision), APRS (Automatic Position Reporting System), and packet radio. SSTV sends still pictures via HF radio over very long distances. APRS allows wireless tracking of the location of objects in a region. Packet radio allows allows direct person to person wireless communication via a keyboard and the sending of wireless messages (email).

Directions

The FARS field day will be held at the Maryknoll seminary, the same site as last year.

To find the FARS Field Day site, take Interstate 280 towards the Los Altos / Mountain View border. Exit onto Foothill Expressway and head south. Make a right turn onto Cristo Rey Drive (first light). Follow signs towards Rancho San Antonio Park. Follow Cristo Rey Drive (~ 3/4 mile) until you reach Rancho San Antonio Park and turn right into the Maryknoll (private) driveway. Go past the gate, turn right and park next to the Eucalyptus trees. If you end up at the seminary building, you've gone too far. Go back to Cristo Rey drive and head back to Rancho San Antonio Park. Enter the drive across from the park.

Our Field Day operation is located in the large open field next to the parking area. Please do not disturb the Seminary residents located in the buildings northwest of our location. They have generously allowed us to use this location on their property for our Field Day operation.

How to get to regular meetings: (Visitors always welcome)

Our meetings are held at the Covington Elementary School (directions below) on the fourth Friday. Socializing at 7 PM with the regular meeting at 7:30 PM. There may be changes in the meeting dates for January, June, November, and December.

DIRECTIONS:

From Interstate 280. take the El Monte exit Northeast. Cross Foothill Expressway. (A) At the first traffic light turn right on Covington. (B) Immediately at the fork take the left street (Covington). Go about 1/10th of a mile. Turn left into the parking lot. The gym is the tall building to your right with red and white stripes.

From Foothill Expwy. From Foothill Expressway, take the El Monte exit and go Northeast; then follow directions as above at point (A).

From US101 or El Camino: take San Antonio Road west (to Foothill Expressway). Then follow directions as above at point (A).
