October Meeting Report

Edison Fong, WB6IQN, spoke about his design of dual-band Jpole antennas for the 2-meter and 70-cm bands. The antenna, featured in *QST* in February 2003, has a coaxial trap that divides the radiator section of the antenna and gives an improved radiation pattern on 70 cm. The DBJ-1 is sheathed in a PVC tube, while the DBJ-2 is an unsheathed, roll-up version.

Barbara Neuhauser, AE6RM

Long ago a science fair judge suggested that I become an amateur radio operator. I did so, thanks to ARRL publications, and I greatly enjoyed building small homebrew projects. However, I had little confidence as an operator because there was no Elmer to demonstrate procedures. As an adult I let my license expire because I could not operate an amateur station from my apartment.

Recently students in my electronics class at SFSU asked how they could extend their knowledge of electronics. QRP projects seemed ideal, so we organized a club in which each student builds a SW20+ transceiver, a PAC-12 antenna, and a Tenna-dipper. Obviously I am not well qualified to teach operating techniques. FARS, however, offers a superb combination of high-quality technical training and friendly coaching on procedures. As a board member I would encourage FARS to mentor students, thereby increasing the participation of young people in our hobby.

Morse Code Practice

Students learning Morse need more practice than weekly on a repeater. Here are some resources that can help with daily practice.

The W5YI/Gordon West's "0-to-5 wpm" code lessons are available in 8-CD and 6-cassette formats priced at \$30. Either set is recommended for beginners. Gordo's 2-CD or 2-cassette \$15 abbreviated "refresher" course, and ARRL similar offering don't offer enough practice.

ARRL's "Your Introduction to Morse Code" (0-to-5 wpm) is available in 2-CD and 2-cassette formats. Both sets have 2-1/2 hours of practice and cost \$15. Same comment as above.

W1AW code practice MP3 files are at http://www.arrl.org/w1aw/morse.html

William Sizemore W6ADO in Los Angeles offered Morse practice 24 hours a day on 7.100 MHz. However, he received warning letters in April and June 2005 from the FCC concerning his control operators for 24-hour operation. He may have reduced his schedule or stopped.

- For advanced CW contesters, there's Alex Shovkoplyas VE3NEA's Morse Runner. Download from http://www.dxatlas.com/MorseRunner/

DIRECTIONS:

From Interstate 280. take the El Monte exit Northeast. Cross Foothill Expressway. (A) At the first traffic light turn right on Covington. (B) Immediately at the fork take the left street (Covington). Go about 1/10th of a mile. Turn left into the parking lot. The gym is the tall building to your right with red and white stripes.

From Foothill Expwy., take the El Monte exit and go Northeast; then follow directions as above at point (A).

From US101 or El Camino: take San Antonio Road west (to Foothill Expressway). Then follow directions above at point (A).

TALK-IN via the <u>N6NFI</u> (145.230-; 100Hz PL) repeater or the <u>W6ASH</u> 145.27- (100Hz PL) repeater.
