February Club Meeting

Speaker: Martin Knutson, W0BBV

Topic: A Technical History of Modern Cellular Telephone Systems

Summary: Vehicle-borne two-way radios came of age during the Second World War. This talk picks up the thread in 1946, when this technology and the wired telephone network were joined together to produce the first "mobile telephone system (MTS)", and carries the story to the modern day. This historical arc includes the evolution of MTS into the first cellular system in the late 1970s, the transition to digital cellular starting in the late 1980s, and the "third generation (3G)" which is currently entering wide use. A theme in this presentation is the continuing impact of the technical decisions made more than 60 years ago.

About the Speaker: John Treichler received his BA and MEE degrees from Rice University, Houston, TX in 1970 and his PhDEE from Stanford in 1977. He served as a line officer in the US Navy from 1970 to 1974. In 1977 he joined ARGOSystems in Sunnyvale CA and then helped found Applied Signal Technology, Inc. in 1984 after serving for a year as an Associate Professor of Electrical Engineering at Cornell University. Applied Signal Technology designs and builds advanced signal processing equipment which is used by the United States Government and its allies for foreign intelligence collection. He is currently their Chief Technical Officer and a member of its board of directors. He was elected a Fellow in the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE) in 1991 and was awarded the IEEE Signal Processing Society's Technical Achievement Award in 2000.

There will be four prizes for the meeting. First is a Heil Sound "The Traveler" Boomset. Second is an Eton (Grundig) American Red Cross Portable Emergency Radio that covers AM, FM, and Shortwave. It's battery operated with a handcrank to charge the battery. Third is a 2007 ARRL Handbook. Fourth is a 2008 Northern California Repeater Directory.

How to get to FARS Club meetings (Visitors always welcome)

DIRECTIONS:

From Interstate 280. take the El Monte exit Northeast. Cross Foothill Expressway. (A) At the first traffic light turn right on Covington. (B) Immediately at the fork take the left street (Covington). Go about 1/10th of a mile. Turn left into the parking lot. The gym is the tall building to your right with red and white stripes.

From Foothill Expwy., take the El Monte exit and go Northeast; then follow directions as above at point (A).

From US101 or El Camino: take San Antonio Road west (to Foothill Expressway). Then follow directions above at point (A).
