**Speaker**: John E. Hill, N6CRA **Topic**: Antennas I Have Known

**Summary**: John Hill, N6CRA, has been involved with advanced antenna development during a long career. He will describe some interesting antennas that may be unfamiliar to many Radio Amateurs, most notably microwave antennas that operate above 1 GHz, such as the space shuttle antennas. He will also cover some antenna theory without invoking James Clerk Maxwell or his equations. You may remember John Hill from his presentation at Am-Tech Day last year (May, 2008).

He then reviewed instructions on getting started in ATV. K6BEN is a crossband repeater for amateur television transmission. The input is on 1255 MHz. ## **New Sound System**


Perhaps you heard and saw the new audio system at the July meeting. It sounds great! We now have two lapel mics, one handheld mic (ordered separately) and two headset mics. There are two receivers that work independently on the two channels and an amp/speaker with 80 watts (as opposed to 15 watts on the old system). It has two independent line in jacks: one 1/4" jack for receiver and RCA jacks (L+R) for computer in. The system comes in a compact aluminum brief case and can be set-up in minutes. Each receiver has 16 channels to choose from ranging from 709 MHz to 808 MHz. More information can be seen at the following websites.

# Local radio society to transmit around the world

Town Crier Report

he Foothills Amateur Radio Society is scheduled to demonstrate the capabilities of amateur radio during Amateur Radio Field Day 11 a.m. Saturday through 11 a.m. Sunday.

The society will set up its operation in a field at 23000 Cristo Rey Drive, next to the Maryknoll Residence near the Rancho San Antonio County Park near Los Altos.

The society will operate four radio stations during this period and attempt to make as many contacts as possible with amateur radio stations throughout North and South America, using voice, Morse code, radio teletype and digital packet radio.

There are more than 650,000 amateur radio operators in the United States and approximately 2.5 million worldwide.

The exercise in emergency radio communications begins with setting up radio stations under field conditions.

The amateur operators erect antennas, assemble radio stations and power electric generators to simulate actual emergency conditions.

Amateur radio operators frequently provide communications support during emergencies such as the Sept. 11, 2001, terrorist attacks.

## How to get to FARS Club meetings (Visitors always welcome)

Meetings are held at the Covington Elementary School (directions below) on the fourth Friday. Socializing at 7 PM with the regular meeting at 7:30 PM. There may be changes in the meeting dates for January, June, November, and December.

#### **DIRECTIONS**:

**From Interstate 280**. take the El Monte exit Northeast. Cross Foothill Expressway. (A) At the first traffic light turn right on Covington. (B) Immediately at the fork take the left street (Covington). Go about 1/10th of a mile. Turn left into the parking lot. The gym is the tall building to your right with red and white stripes.

**From Foothill Expwy.**, take the El Monte exit and go Northeast; then follow directions as above at point (A).

**From US101 or El Camino**: take San Antonio Road west (to Foothill Expressway). Then follow directions above at point (A).

**TALK-IN** via the N6NFI (145.230-; 100Hz PL) repeater or the W6ASH 145.27- (100Hz PL) repeater.
