Time: Socializing at 7PM, Meeting starts at 7:30PM **Place**: Covington School, 205 Covington Road, Los Altos (near Foothill Expressway and El Monte Rd)

"Brewing Projects the Arduino Way" Umesh Ghodke K6VUG and Nimi Hongyim K6XOX

Umesh and Nimit will focus on home brew projects using Arduino microcontrollers, a versatile system with many interesting applications. Their presentations will provide a deeper understanding of the Arduino microcontroller and how it can be used to make exciting and fun home-brew projects. Tonight's presentations are timely and will prepare you to understand projects featured at the 2012 Maker Faire coming up on May 19-20.

Umesh K6VUG will show a light weight portable rotator for satellite antenna, consisting of two RC Servo Motors for accurate Azimuth and Elevation positioning of the antenna. An Arduino Pro Mini controls the servos in response to commands from a Satellite Tracking program.

Nimit K6XOX will show two projects that he built based on Arduino Bootloader: (1) A custom-made APRS Tiny Tracker from Opensource. Nimit will show the schematic and explain how it works; and (2) a Geiger Counter interfaced for APRS packet transmission. Nimit will talk about the kit and show the demo board. Nimit will also talk about using Proteus Software for schematic capture and board layout for PCB design. He will show how Proteus makes PCB design and fabrication simple.

Snacks: Cookies and coffee will be served. **Questions:** Bring your hardest radio questions. The mysterious Dr. Know-It-All reveals all answers.

The ARRL Field Day 2012 is the biggest annual event for FARS as well as many other amateur radio clubs.

FARS will be participating in the 3-A category again this year, with stations setup for 24 hours of operating:

- **HF station** operating Single Sideband (SSB) voice on 10/15/20/40m
- HF station operating CW (Morse code) and other digital modes like PSK31 and RTTY (keyboard) on 10/15/20/40/80m.
- HF station SSB voice on 80/160m (Beverage antenna!)
- VHF/Satellite station
- GOTA (Get On The Air) station

YOUR FIELD DAY 2012 GUIDE

OBJECTIVE:

To work as many stations as possible on any and all amateur bands (excluding the 60, 30, 17, and 12-meter bands) and to learn to operate in abnormal situations in less than optimal conditions.

FARS LOCATION:

The Maryknoll Residence in Los Altos (on the soccer field) 23000 Cristo Rey Drive, Los Altos, CA (near Rancho San Antonio Park).

This is the same Field Day site that FARS has used in years past. GPS coordinates $37^{\circ}19.962^{'}$ N by $122^{\circ}04.919^{'}$ W







DIRECTIONS:

- Take Interstate 280 towards the Los Altos / Mountain View border.
- Exit onto Foothill Expressway and head south (~1/4 mile) following signs to Rancho San Antonio.
- Turn RIGHT onto Cristo Rey Drive (first light).
- Follow Cristo Rey Drive until you reach a traffic circle (~3/4 mile).
- Take the SECOND EXIT from the circle marked with a small brown sign that says Park. This is the continuation of Cristo Rey Drive
- Go shortly past Rancho San Antonio Park entrance (on the left) and then turn RIGHT into the Maryknoll (private) driveway.
- Pass through the gate, take an immediate RIGHT into the paved area, and park next to the Eucalyptus trees.

What is Field Day?

Field Day is a picnic, a campout, practice for emergencies, an informal contest and, most of all, FUN!

ARRL Field Day is the single most popular on-the-air event held annually in the US and Canada. On the fourth weekend of June of each year, more than 35,000 radio amateurs gather with their clubs, groups or simply with friends to operate from remote locations.

It is a time where many aspects of Amateur Radio come together to highlight our many roles. While some will treat it as a contest, other groups use the opportunity to practice their emergency response capabilities. It is an excellent opportunity to demonstrate Amateur Radio to the organizations that Amateur Radio might serve in an emergency, as well as the general public. For many clubs, ARRL Field Day is one of the highlights of their annual calendar.

The contest part is simply to contact as many other stations as possible and to learn to operate our radio gear in abnormal situations and less than optimal conditions.

We use these same skills when we help with events such as marathons and bike-a-thons; fund-raisers such as walk-a-thons; celebrations such as parades; and exhibits at fairs, malls and museums — these are all large, preplanned, non-emergency activities.

But despite the development of very complex, modern communications systems — or maybe because they ARE so complex — ham radio has been called into action again and again to provide communications in crises when it really matters. Amateur Radio people (also called "hams") are well known for our communications support in real disaster and post-disaster situations.

*** Interested In Operating at FARS? ***

FARS has open operating positions for phone, CW, and digital (RTTY, PSK31).

Elmers will be available for assistance picking out call signs, working the radios, logging the contacts, and understanding what to do!

(For example, Joanna K6YL will coach on the HF phone station for as many hours as needed on Saturday afternoon and evening, and even Sunday morning, just let her know!)

The exchange is fairly easy:

"K6YA 3 Alpha Santa Clara Valley"

(where 3 Alpha is our entry category – 3 for # of counted transmitters and A for power)

For our **GOTA** (**Get On The Air**) **station**, which is for those with little or no HF experience (inquire with Mikey NE6RD if you qualify), the exchange will be under a different callsign. The GOTA station will the only station under a different call sign. That call sign will likely be NE6RD and thus the exchange will be:

"NE6RD 3 Alpha Santa Clara Valley"

All stations on Field Day will be limited to 150 watts.

FARS will be running all operations off of generators.

REPORT: 63rd Annual INTERNATIONAL DX CONVENTION 2012

Sponsored by the SoCal and NorCal DX Clubs (SCDXC and NCDXC)

The 63^{rd} Annual IDXC was held April 20^{th} through 22^{nd} in Visalia, California and was attended by over 800 people (a record!). Amongst the 800 were over 40 who'd travelled internationally to this convention, representing: Germany, Spain, Great Britain, Japan, Mongolia, Norway, Sweden, Hawaii, Canada, Mexico, and New Zealand!

The convention consisted of the usual commercial vendor booths, ham radio demonstrations, speakers and seminars, but this convention also has a unique social quality far beyond other ham conventions I have attended. It's like a three day party with engaging conversations in every direction. Whether or not you've met these people before you'll now be able to put faces to call signs, and not coming back next year somehow becomes unimaginable.



OPERATING REPORT: ROOKIE ROUNDUP SSB 2012

The ARRL Rookie Roundup SSB took place on Sunday, April 15th, with the goal to get as many rookies on the air as possible. A Rookie was defined for this contest as licensed in 2012, 2011 or 2010. Rick N6DQ and I began trying to round up rookies for operation at his QTH back in March, with the idea of using a triplexer on his K4KIO Hexbeam to allow operation of at least 2 stations at one time on 15m and 20m (3 stations pending cooperation of 10 meters). We were very interested in elmering rookies and encouraging them in any way we could, as I was given many opportunities as a rookie and in fact won this contest a couple times. When Rebar N6DB stepped in and offered to open up Stanford W6YX for our operation we jumped at the opportunity because for this 100 watt contest the antennas and elevation can make a world of difference! Stanford W6YX was in fact where I operated from as a rookie for this same contest.

When Sunday morning rolled around the rookies were on time at the Stanford gate and excited to operate! – Peter KJ6PUN, Keith KJ6PUO (Peter's father, also a rookie), and Daniel KJ6SEE. The exchange included call sign, name, year of first license, and state. Anyone could be contacted for points but contacts with other rookies were worth double the points. Every new state and Canadian province provided a big multiplier! We used WriteLog as our logging software, which the rookies picked up quickly. After the contest the feedback was that they had an incredible time and

they were ready for more!


