OPERATING REPORT: PORTABLE FROM OCEANO DUNES SVRA. CA

When I first purchased my Yaesu FT-857 I'd intended it for HF mobile. Long story short it still hasn't made it into the vehicle but it has become invaluable for operating portable during our travel. I can no longer imagine a trip without a rig! Part of the enjoyment is adding to the log book, and part of the enjoyment is setting up the equipment and "playing" with the antenna.

Over Labor Day weekend Rick N6DQ and I packed up for a trip with family to the Oceano Dunes SVRA just south of San Luis Obispo. My truck got us onto the beach where we picked a spot and set up shop for 5 days.

The choice of antenna for this trip was a Comet H-422 40-10m dipole, hoisted to the top of a temporary mast. It was interesting to plan out the best antenna for use in a situation where there are no trees and no easy means of securing guy lines to the ground (sand!). The area is also known for gnarly sand storms each afternoon that flatten tents and, of course, shape beautiful sand dunes for miles. (A pair of safety glasses over your sunglasses and the sand storms are fun I swear, you just look funny hi hi.)


We knew we could use sand as a weight to hold down each guy line, but Rick N6DQ came up with the great idea to use garbage bags as a means for containing the sand. The heavy weight contractor garbage bags didn't take up much packing space and they certainly did the trick! When the wind really started picking up the first afternoon we added a 2nd level of guy lines (not shown in the first photo below) and that was it, we never had to lower or adjust the antenna again.




REPORT: The September BARC Meeting

The Bay Area Radio Builders Club (BARC) continues to meet on the second Thursday of each month. Due to changes in The Tech Shop's room reservation policy the club is looking for a new meeting location. The September meeting was held in a different section of the Menlo Park Tech Shop -- the snack area of the common room -- and the group did their best considering the poor lighting conditions.

Five hams began assembling WWV receivers on prototyping boards from 28 electronic components each. The parts for each radio cost only \$14 – a very inexpensive educational experience. One person finished during the September meeting and was able to listen to WWV with Walkman headphones and a random wire antenna. The other assemblers should get theirs working at the October meeting.

WWV is the call sign of the United States National Institute of Standards and Technology's (NIST) HF ("shortwave") radio station in Fort Collins, Colorado. WWV continuously transmits official U.S. Government frequency and time signals on 2.5, 5, 10, 15 and 20 MHz. These carrier frequencies and time signals are controlled by local atomic clocks traceable to NIST's primary standard in Boulder, Colorado by GPS common view observations and other time transfer methods. NIST also operates the very similar radio station WWVH in Kauai, Hawaii. WWV and WWVH make recorded announcements; since they share frequencies, WWV uses a male voice to distinguish itself from WWVH, which uses a female voice. They also make other recorded announcements of general interest, e.g., the GPS satellite constellation status and severe oceanic weather warnings. WWV shares its Fort Collins site with radio station WWVB that transmits carrier and time code (no voice) on 60 kHz in the low frequency (LF) band.

PARACHUTE MOBILE: Saturday 10/13 in Concert with Pacificon

The next jump mission is scheduled for October 13th in coordination with the Pacificon amateur radio convention in Santa Clara.

The jump team will arrive at the Byron, CA Drop Zone about 10 am and the first jump is expected to be made be between 12:00 pm and 1 pm. They will make multiple jumps, weather permitting until 6 pm.

QSTs regarding take off times and expected drop times will be announced on 146.430 simplex, 145.230 - 100 and 147.060 + 100. ("So folks know when the jumpers will be loading on the plane, when they leave the plane, and when they land.")

APRS data will load live on http://aprs.fi under the calls AF6IM and KF6WRW depending on which jumper is aloft.

The jumpers are planning to send live video by both ATV and the internet to http://justin.tv.

QSO's will be on either 146.430 or 147.570 simplex FM.

From Interstate 280. take the El Monte exit Northeast. Cross Foothill Expressway. (A) At the first traffic light turn right on Covington. (B) Immediately at the fork take the left street (Covington). Go about 1/10th of a mile. Turn left into the parking lot. The gym is the tall building to your right with red and white stripes.

From Foothill Expwy., take the El Monte exit and go Northeast; then follow directions as above at point (A).

From US101 or El Camino: take San Antonio Road west (to Foothill Expressway). Then follow directions above at point (A).
