Presentation



Satellite Tracking
by
Don Anastasia, AA6W

Don will give an introduction to Amateur Radio satellite communication with an emphasis on the International Space Station, and he will demonstrate a PC-based Amateur Radio satellite tracking program. This promises to be an exciting and educational presentation.

About the speaker: Don Anastasia, AA6W, was first licensed as Novice WD6EPV in 1977. After advancing to Extra, Don earned his Satellite DXCC award from ARRL in 1989. He confirmed 125 countries via 2-way satellite. Don has been a member of AMSAT since 1998 and has operated through Amsat AO-40, AO-13, AO-10 and many others. Don has organized numerous ARISS (Amateur Radio Onboard International Space Station) school contacts, to allow school children to successfully communicate with onboard astronauts and ask them science questions from school via 2-way Amateur Radio. Don is a substitute school teacher in Saratoga and Menlo Park, where he teaches language arts, social sciences (history), and other subjects to K-8 children. Don holds an AA degree in liberal arts from West Valley College and a B.A in social sciences - history from Santa Clara University. You can meet him at HRO in Sunnyvale, where he works part time.

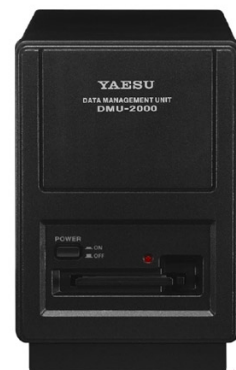

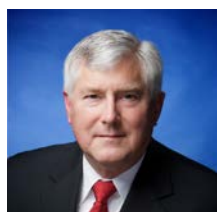
