

# **EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS**

#### **Take Action**

Living in California means living in earthquake country. At any moment an earthquake can strike without warning, and the recent Napa Valley earthquake is a reminder of how devastating and close to home an earthquake can be. I sincerely hope everyone in the FARS family came through unharmed, but even then I'm sure several of us know someone who was impacted.

With each earthquake we see headlines such as "Preparedness put to the test". What we do to prepare now, before the next disaster, determines our quality of life after such an event. Think about where you are right now while you read this. If a disaster hits, what supplies will you have access to? What is the plan for contacting your family and friends? You should be prepared to survive on your own, without basic services such as electricity, gas, water, sewage treatment and telephones. This means having your own food, water and other supplies. Being an amateur radio operator is just one important piece of the puzzle. Please ensure you are prepared!

# All Americans should have basic supplies on hand to survive for at least 3 days if an emergency occurs.

#### How much water should you store for an emergency?

A minimum of one gallon a day for each person and pet, to be used for drinking, cooking and sanitation.



#### Why is bleach a recommended item to keep in your Emergency Supply Kit?

When diluted nine parts water to one part bleach, bleach can be used as a disinfectant. Or in an emergency, you can use it to treat water by using 16 drops of regular household liquid bleach per gallon of water. (Note: Do not use scented bleach, color safe bleach, or bleaches with added cleaners.)



#### **How many Emergency Supply Kits are recommended?**

- 1 FULL KIT where you live
- 1 SMALLER PORTABLE KIT in your vehicle
- 1 SMALLER KIT at your workplace
- 1 SMALLER KIT anywhere else you spend time

# The RST System

#### R = READABILITY

- 1 -- Unreadable
- 2 -- Barely readable, occasional words distinguishable
- 3 -- Readable with considerable difficulty
- 4 -- Readable with practically no difficulty
- 5 -- Perfectly readable

#### S = SIGNAL STRENGTH

- 1 -- Faint signals, barely perceptible
- 2 -- Very weak signals
- 3 -- Weak signals
- 4 -- Fair signals
- 5 -- Fairly good signals
- 6 -- Good signals
- 7 -- Moderately strong signals
- 8 -- Strong signals
- 9 -- Extremely strong signals

#### T = TONE (CW only)

- 1 -- Sixty cycle a.c. or less, very rough and broad
- 2 -- Very rough a.c., very harsh and broad
- 3 -- Rough a.c. tone, rectified but not filtered
- 4 -- Rough note, some trace of filtering
- 5 -- Filtered rectified a.c. but strongly ripple-modulated
- 6 -- Filtered tone, definite trace of ripple modulation
- 7 -- Near pure tone, trace of ripple modulation
- 8 -- Near perfect tone, slight trace of modulation
- 9 -- Perfect tone, no trace of ripple or modulation of any kind



Meetings are held at the Covington Elementary School on the fourth Friday. Socializing at 7 PM with the regular meeting at 7:30 PM. There may be changes in the meeting dates for January, June, November, and December.

**From Interstate 280** – Take the El Monte exit Northeast. Cross Foothill Expressway. \* At the first traffic light turn right on Covington. Immediately at the fork take the left street (Covington). Go about 1/10th of a mile. Turn left into the parking lot. The gym is the tall building to your right with red and white stripes.

**From Foothill Expwy** – Turn Northeast onto El Monte, then follow directions as above at the \*.

**From US101 or El Camino** – Take San Antonio Road west (to Foothill Expressway), then follow directions as above at the \*.
